Course Outline

Module 1: Foundations of Sign Language

- Introduction to the history and linguistic structure of sign languages.

- Case Study: A customer service representative uses basic greetings and fingerspelling to welcome a Deaf customer.

- Role-playing scenarios in various settings (e.g., medical office, school, restaurant).
- Expressing emotions, feelings, and opinions through signs.
- Practicing telling short stories and narratives.
- Group exercises for real-time conversational practice.
- Case Study: A teacher uses sign language to read a story to a class of Deaf and hearing students.

Module 6: Specialized Vocabulary

- Learning signs for professional fields (e.g., medical, legal, technical).
- Communicating in an emergency or high-stress situation.

- Signs related to technology and modern life.
- Using signs to convey complex, abstract concepts.

- Advocating for better accessibility in public and private spaces.
- Understanding the legal frameworks for accessibility (e.g., ADA).
- Finding and participating in Deaf community events and organizations.
- Case Study: A group of graduates from the course organizes a community event to promote sign language awareness.
